

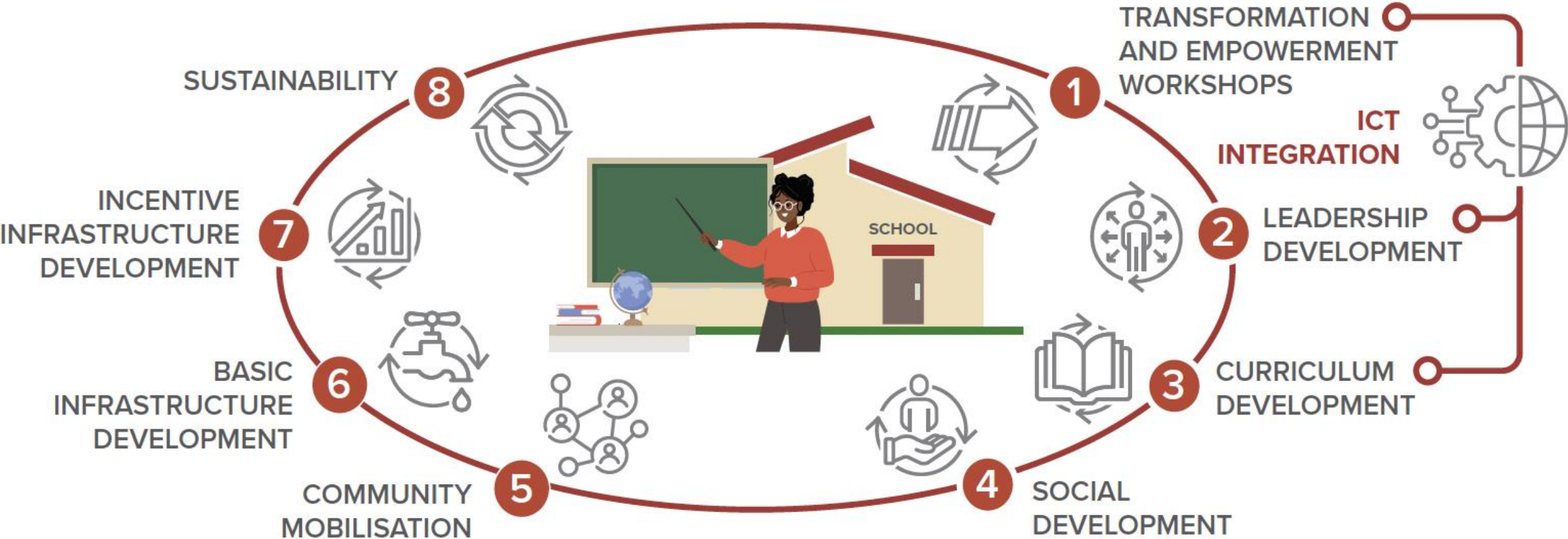

Frameworks informing KT Model delivery

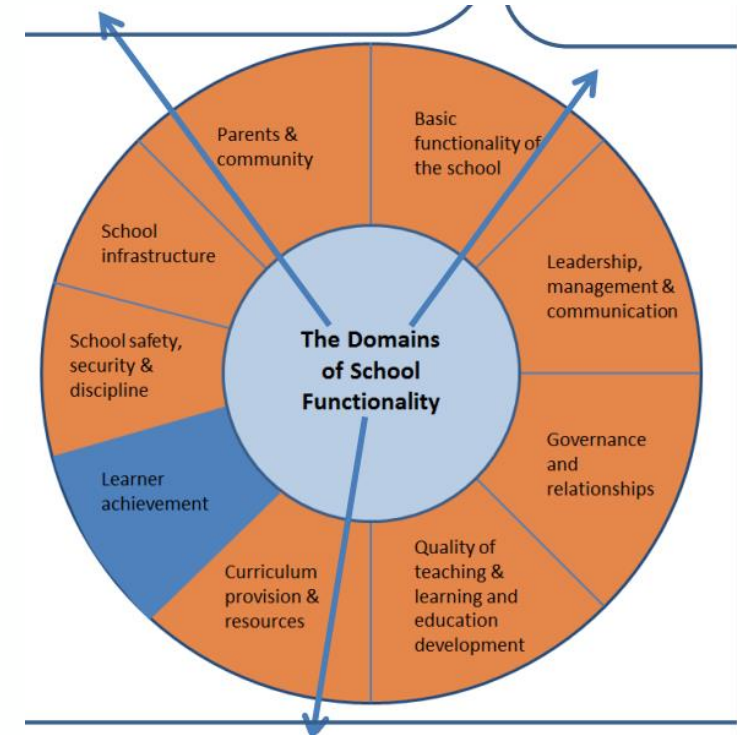
Quality Education is an **equalizer** and a **tool** for **inclusive socio-economic transformation** and **lifelong learning opportunities**.

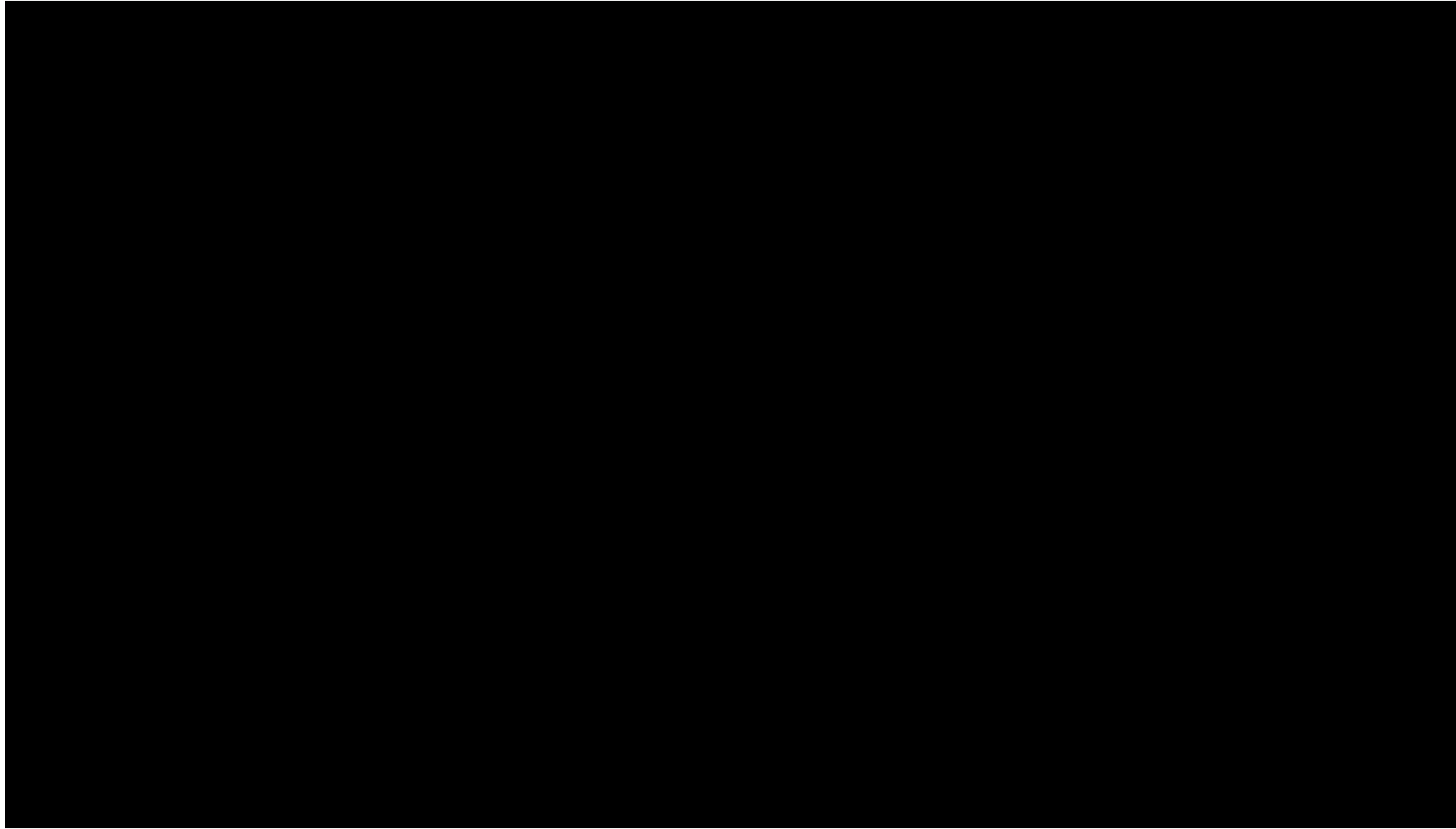
